## What is Arts Access?

ASI's Arts Access program, launched in 2013, connects Western New Yorkers to diverse arts and cultural events. We view art as essential, not a luxury, and aim to break down barriers like cost, transportation, language, and effort. Eligibility is open to anyone receiving income-based public assistance in WNY. Passes are honored at our 50+ partner locations, all dedicated to making the arts accessible to everyone. ASI offers safe transportation to and from events upon request. Join us in fostering a more inclusive arts scene in WNY.

In order to be eligible for an Arts Access pass, you must be currently on income based public assistance (SNAP, Medicaid, TANF, HEAP, etc.) and present an active benefit card, with your name on it, when signing up online, over the phone, or in-person. If you have any questions on whether a form of public assistance is accepted or not, please call (716) 833-3004 x514.
